# Message from Wendy

The 2021-22 school year created challenges for STEMblazers as we continued to navigate various COVID 19 protocols. Each one of our team members, including, Teacher Sponsors, Chapter Leaders, and Guest Speakers, stepped up to provide continued support as we all worked together, most often in "real time", to ensure students had as many opportunities as possible to meet and become inspired by incredible women in STEM. As I reflect on the past two years, I continue to draw inspiration from our passion-fueled community.

I'm so proud to share that STEMblazers is eight years strong and has served 1300+ students! It has been an honor and pleasure to serve so many amazing girls as middle school and high school students and watch them grow. I continue to be in awe of these incredible young women as they rise and watch who they become. STEMblazers understands the need for ongoing support, and we have expanded our programs to include our alumni as they persist in STEM post-secondary education. As studies have shown, students, especially young women, are in need of continued mentorship while pursuing their education and careers in STEM. STEMblazers has witnessed this first-hand with many first and second-year University students carrying a rigorous course load and often found themselves as the only female student or the only person of color in their classes. Some of our first-generation alumni overcame situations where they were bullied and without resources or experienced parents to help them navigate these challenges. I am determined, along with our entire organization, to help each and every one of our alumni to connect to resources and the support they need to rise!

In addition to building out our alumni program, STEMblazers continues to serve 14 middle school and five high school chapters. In addition, I'm excited to share that <u>STEMblazers launched</u>

<u>a podcast</u> in 2021, expanding the reach of the STEMblazers experience to all girls and young women no matter where they are in the world. The STEMblazers Podcast is hosted by our alumni who share their own thoughts and experiences as young women persisting in STEM to cultivate engaging conversations. This podcast is truly inspiring!

With all the great things happening at STEMblazers, this past Fiscal Year has created some financial challenges, but I can say with great confidence that our leadership team has done an incredible job of stabilizing our foundation and ensuring a pathway forward to sustain and build our programs. With that said, there is so much to be excited about moving onward. Together with our Corporate Partners, we are creating a more robust mentorship program and building out internship opportunities. STEMblazers is committed to directing young women into a workforce pipeline provided by our partners. True to our mission, STEMblazers is inspiring girls to visualize themselves in STEM and creating entry points for our alumni into various industries where they will increase diversity and innovation and ultimately close the gender gap.

As this fiscal year comes to a close, I reflect on our growth as an organization. Growth is imperative to remain creative and to provide an impactful program that transcends. 




